(celtic)

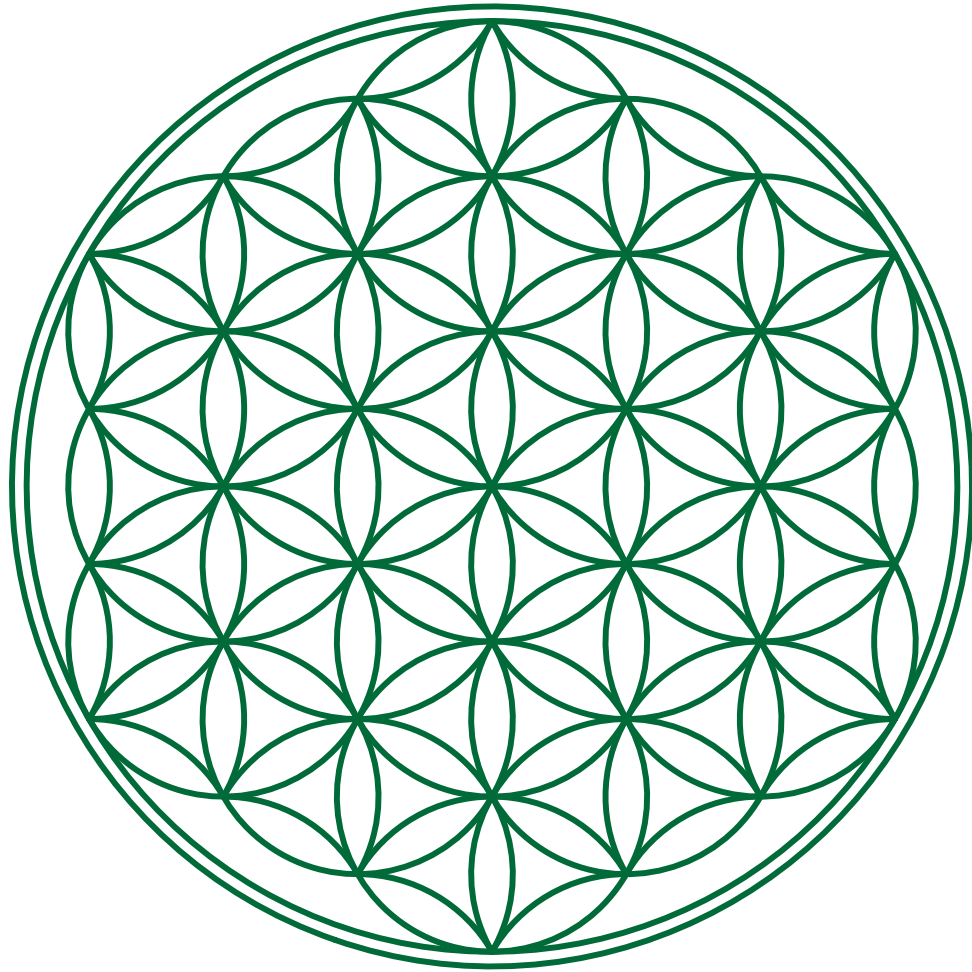
interpreted as protection against the evil eye

(sanskrit)

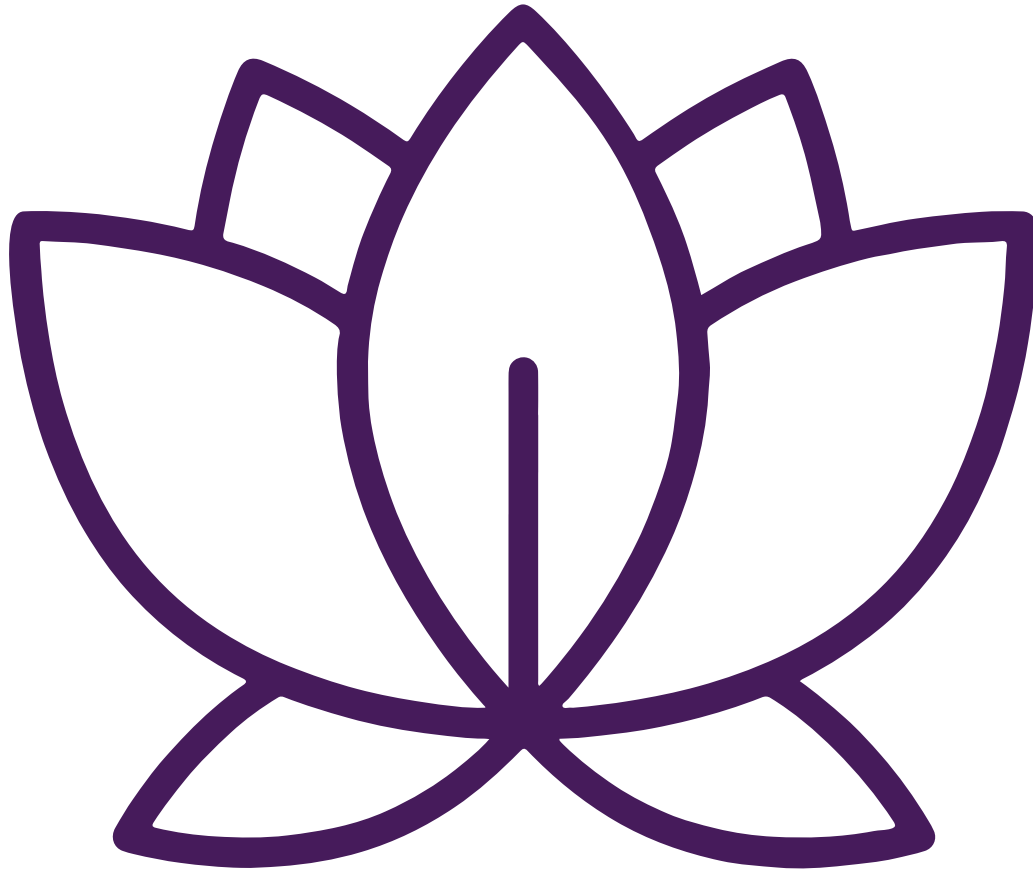
believed to protect against all kinds of

(universal)

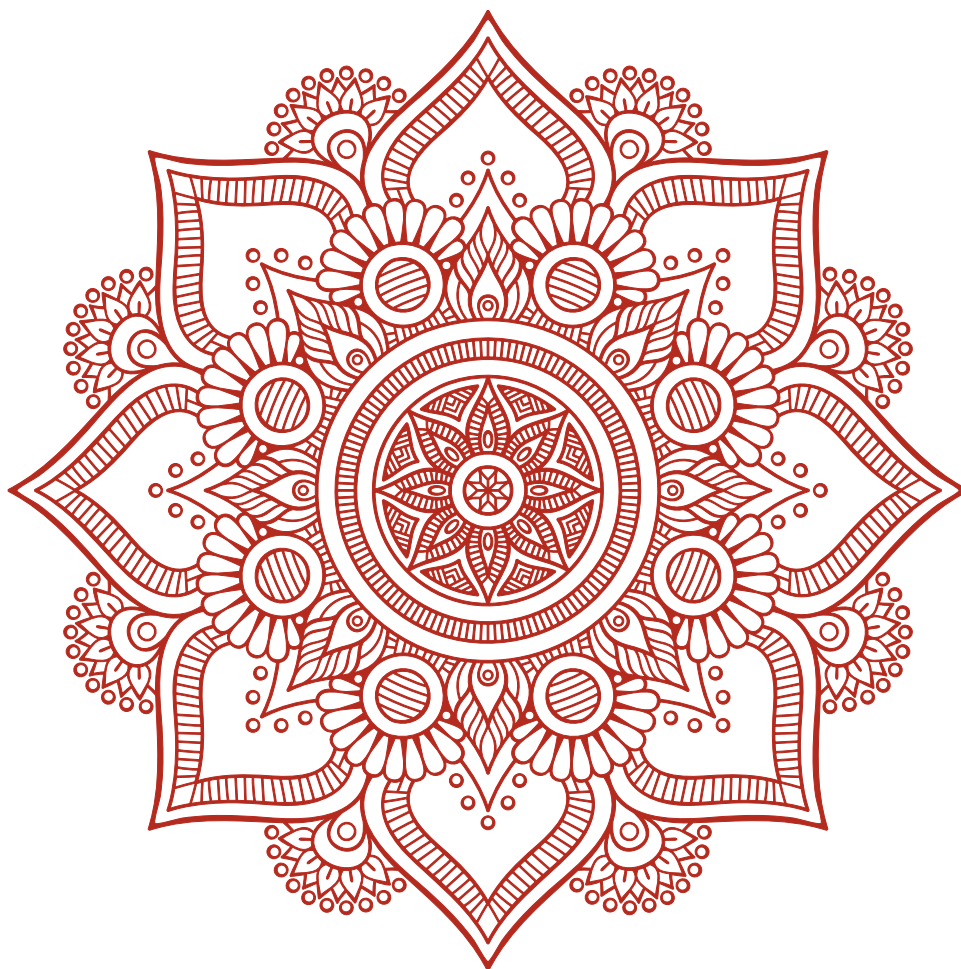
represents transformation, spiritual development

(sanskrit)

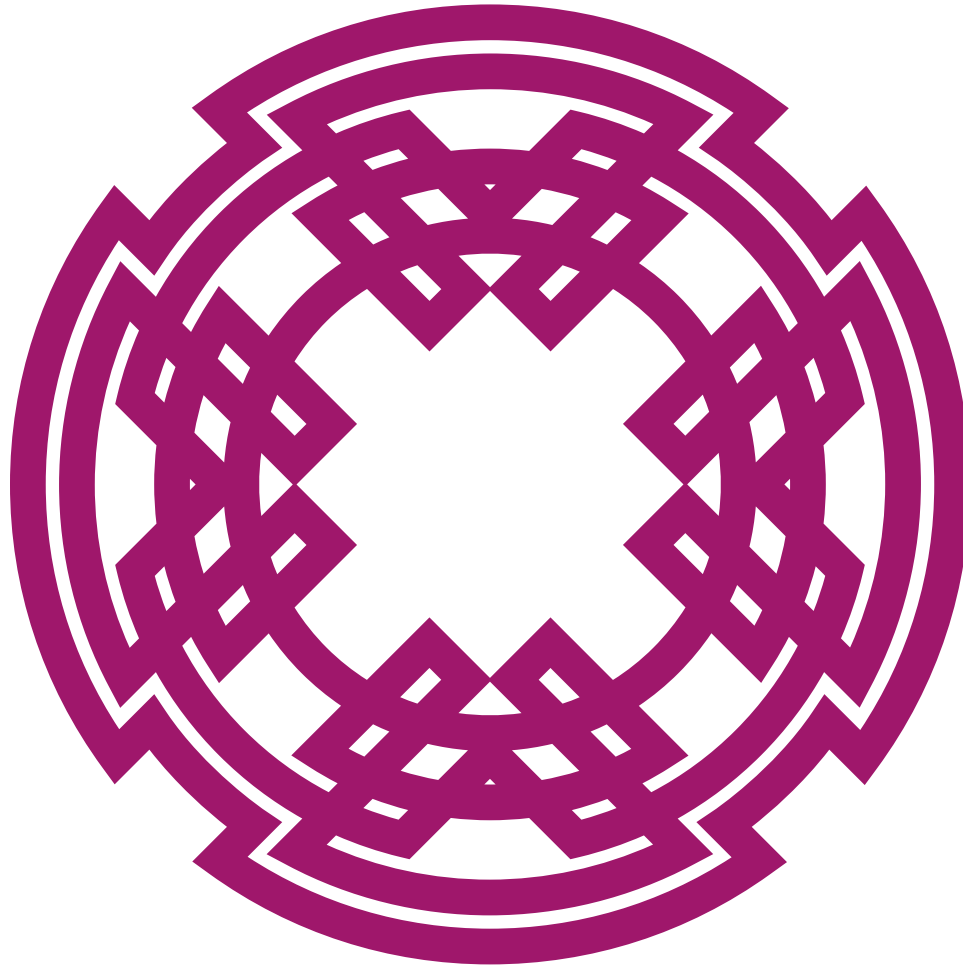
is the powerful symbol of wholeness and connection. re-interpreted immensely,

(celtic)

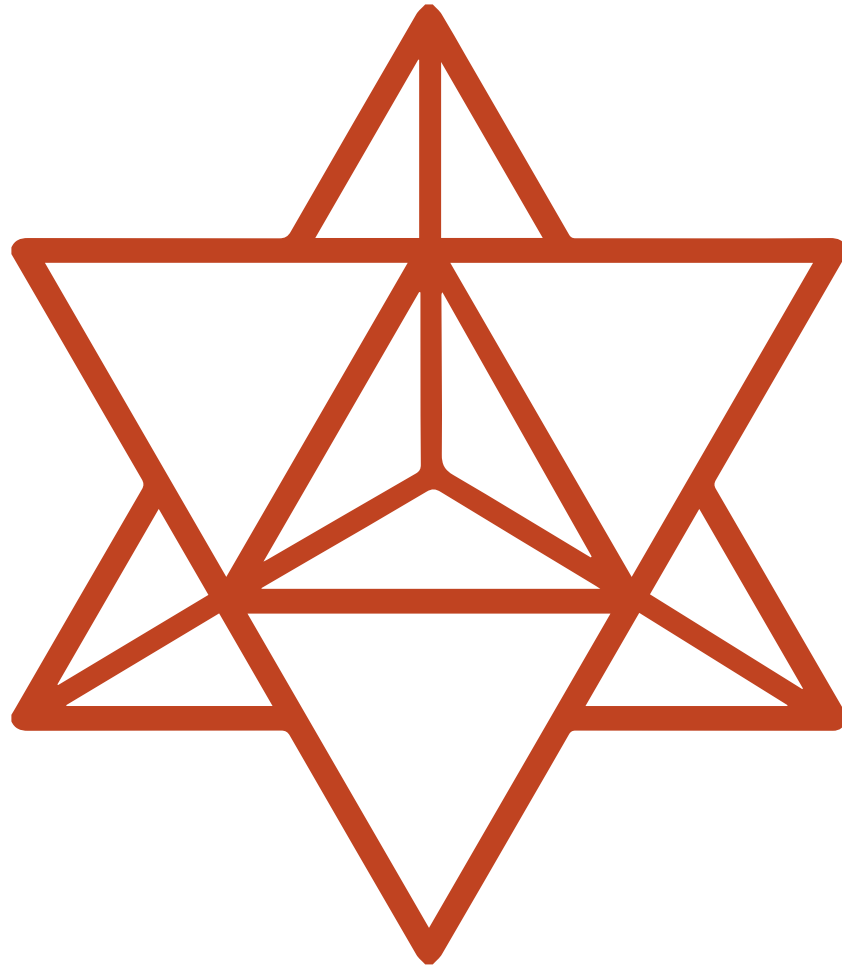
it represents wisdom, strength, power and leadership.

(buddhist)

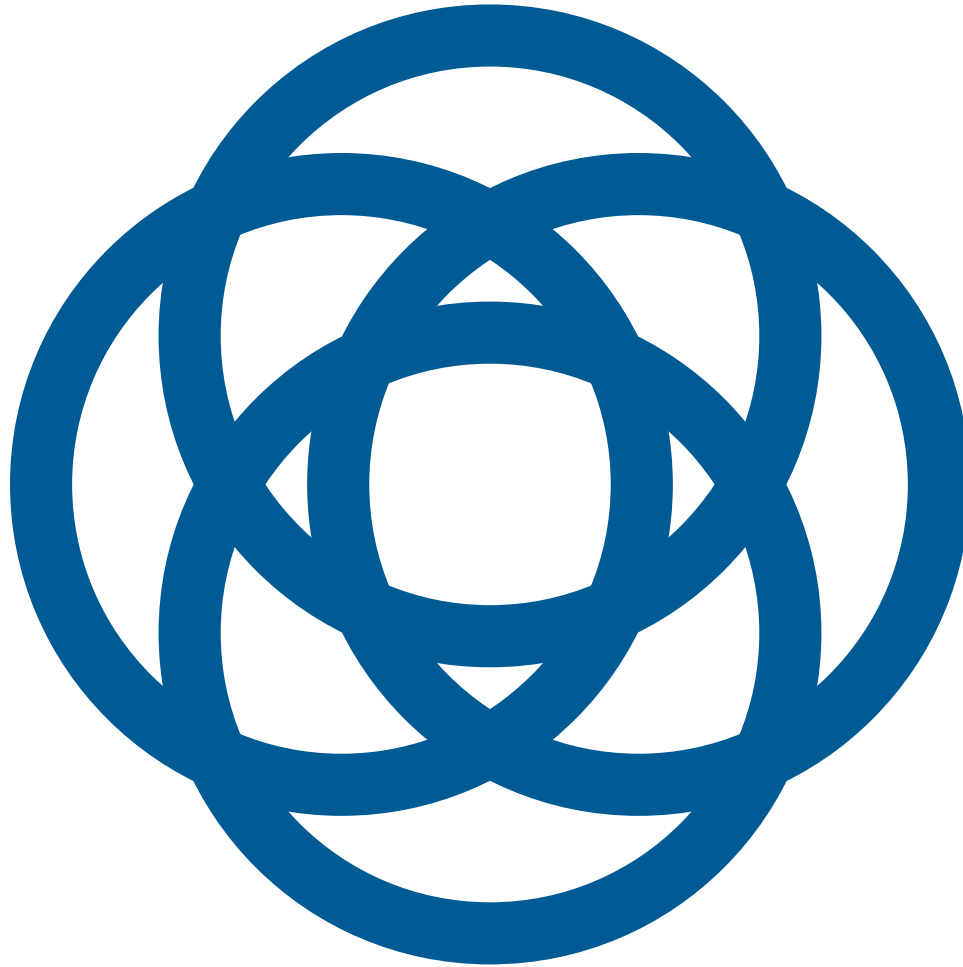
it is a powerful representation of creative force of the universe and

(jewish)

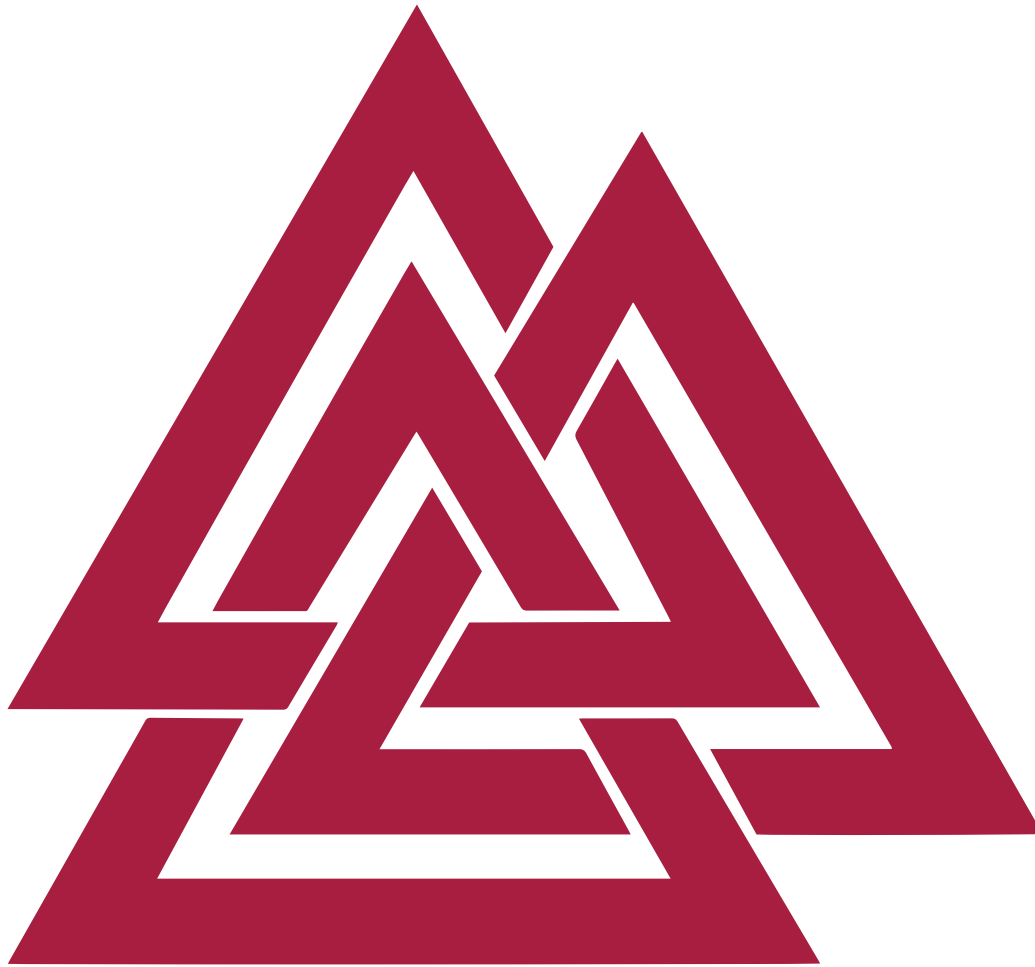
a source of power & enlightenment, used during meditation & focus.
